

### **Citizen Involvement Welcome!**



### **Why Police Should Wear Body Cameras**

"Body-cameras have proven to be invaluable to the American law enforcement community. They boost data and record collection and strengthen community-law enforcement relationships. In fact, a prominent study on body-cams conducted by the Rialto, California Police Department found a <u>90%</u> <u>decrease in citizen complaints</u> against officers who wore cameras.

Without a doubt, body-cams help improve community-policing relationships. They enable law enforcement agencies involved in high-profile incidents to get in front of false narratives, and, ultimately, avoid needless protests, property damage and violence.

But the benefits don't have to end there. When used in conjunction with other technology, such as an effective case management system, body-cam recordings can work even harder as an investigative tool." (Edward Wallace 2018)

### **Introduction to our Community Development Department**

The Public Works Dept. has been introducing itself each month highlighting the dedicated and skilled staff that serves the City. So, what does Community Development do and who makes it happen?

### **Overview of Community Development:**

Provide for the management and coordination of Planning, Permitting, Inspections, Code Enforcement, Floodplain Information and Floodplain Development Reviews for some 2423 land parcels, with another 255 in the City's ETJ. The department is also responsible for the locally customized City building codes.

"We take our role seriously, as 'pre-sponders' of sorts, reviewing construction documents to ensure code compliance and monitoring the Built Environment. On the development end, it is really a team endeavor, with the involvement of the City Manager, the Fire Chief and staff, the Public Works Director and the city's new Engineer in Training, Mr. Tim Nguyen," says Christian Somers, City Building Official. He also serves as a Development Officer and the city's NFIP's Community Rating System (CRS) coordinator.

Christian studied Political Science at Texas A&M and started his code official career with the City of Sugarland in 2001 after years managing construction. He holds certifications from the

International Code Council (ICC) for Plan Reviews and Inspections in the Commercial & Residential Energy, Building, Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing Codes. He is licensed as an Inspector with the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners and is a Certified Floodplain Manager. Christian served as the President of the Brazos Valley Chapter of the ICC, and he is an Energy Code Ambassador for the TX-OK region. In his spare time, he likes to cook, hike and mountain bike.

One of the city's newest employees is Tim Nguyen, EIT (Engineer in Training), replacing the recently retired Engineering Technician. ### Tip of the Month by Matt Jones **SOUTHEAST TEXAS WINTER TIME**

Stay in hitting shape even when you cannot play or hit as much on the range for a few months. Do the 100 Drill, Jan, Feb, Mar. Everyday!!!

- Grab a 7 iron
- With both hands on the middle of the shaft do 25 "touch your toes" (with the shaft)
- With both hands on the middle of the shaft do 25 " squats" (hold shaft out from body)
- With both hands on each end do 25 "twists" ( all the way to left and all the way to right)
- Get you grip and stance, hold the club head one foot above the ground, close your eyes, and make 25 slower than normal real swings keeping your full balance. Hold your finish position for 5 seconds each time.

This will only take 10 minutes, but if you do it EVERYDAY, you won't be as rusty come April!



### **Update on Long Term Flood Recovery Plan**

The City recently received the funds from the state to start elevating the second half of the homes that we received a grant for from our 2017 application. Some work on those homes has begun, and the rest will begin shortly.

Recently the County Commissioners approved the E100 project through Jersey Village. The project should begin within a few weeks. They will do work on the main channel of the bayou through Jersey Village. Overall the project will increase the flow through the channel and provide better protection for Jersey Village.

The City is looking at the next round of home elevation grants. We anticipate the grant application period opening in October, with applications due to the state in November. If the city is awarded the grant it is unlikely work would begin until fall of 2022, based upon the amount of time FEMA review of the information takes.

### **Departmental Promotion**

Sergeant Heath Hawley was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant on December 21, 2020. Lt. Hawley has over 11 years of law enforcement experience. He started his law enforcement career in 2009, after graduating from the East Texas Police Academy, Kilgore Texas. While working in East Texas, he served as a patrol deputy, field training officer, K-9 handler and Criminal Enforcement Deputy until 2015.

In 2015, he and his wife Kendra relocated to the Houston area and he started working for Cy-Fair ISD Police Department. While at Cy-Fair, he was promoted to the rank of Patrol Sergeant and was tasked with creating the first K-9 unit for the department. Under his leadership, the unit grew to four K-9 handlers. During his tenure with the department, he was awarded two Unit Citations, a Life Saving award and the Medal of Valor for

rescuing a Harris County Sheriff's Deputy, who had just been shot. Lt. Hawley put himself in harm's way to retrieve the wounded deputy who was still in the line of fire. He got the deputy to a safe location where he received medical care. He also took on the critical duties of coordinating the district's police response during Hurricane Harvey. This included rescue efforts, officer's schedules and site security at several shelter and reunification locations throughout the district. He was awarded the Hurricane Harvey Bar for his actions during this difficult time.

Lt. Hawley joined the Jersey Village Police Department in November 2019. He serves as the department's field training supervisor, background investigator, and chairs the new applicant oral boards. He received a Life Saving Award for his heroic act of pulling a subject from a burning vehicle in February 2020. He was awarded the Meritorious

Conduct Bar for his exceptional conduct involving exemplary courage, risk and danger to his personal safety. When he was attempting to apprehend a felon in a stolen vehicle, the subject accelerated deliberately hitting him while trying to evade arrest. Lt. Hawley discharged his duty weapon, stopping the threat. Both the suspect and Lt. Hawley received medical attention. The felon was paroled just seven days prior to assaulting him.

### PPE Litter Goes in the Trash - Don't Contribute to Storm Water Pollution

As the public continues to adapt with the unprecedented use of disposable masks, plastic gloves, sanitizing wipes and other personal protective equipment (PPE) it is important to remember that these used items belong in the trash NOT thrown on the ground.

Many municipalities have seen a greater volume of PPE litter discarded on sidewalks, walking/jogging trails, parking lots, and even playgrounds. Given the COVID-19 pandemic, trash disposal has taken on a greater importance in society. The PPE items thrown on the ground which are meant to protect us are contaminated waste. The sanitization workers, volunteers, and others who routinely monitor their areas take a risk when collecting these items for proper placement in the trash.

### COVID is the Most Recent Storm Water Violator!

Not only is the improper disposal of PPE not sanitized, it has a negative effect on the environment. Single-use masks, gloves, wipes, face shields, and empty-sanitization bottles can be collected in storm water runoff and flow directly to local water bodies such as bayous, amenity ponds, detention basins, rivers, and ultimately the ocean. Storm water runoff in our area is NOT treated – whatever enters the storm sewer drainage system is directly discharged to these waterways. The

illicit discharge of PPE can potentially cause clogged/blocked storm sewer pipes, harm local wildlife who mistake it as food, and adversely interfere with water quality as the substances break down overtime. In some cases these items will never breakdown and eventually make their way to the ocean. At this point, we do not know the long-term effects of these items in our local water bodies, but many experts agree that a few months of harmful environmental behavior will take years, many years, to recover.

Unfortunately, illegal dumping and illicit discharges from storm water runoff is nothing new. The City of Jersey Village is required to implement storm water quality programs (such as Storm Water Management Programs/SWMPs) aimed at preventing and minimizing the amount of illicit items entering their municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4). A part of this program targets to educate the general public about the hazards associated with improper disposal of waste and the impact this has on storm water quality.

Adding to this issue is that many volunteerdriven beautification projects, clean-up events, and other outreach measures are prohibited due to local and state regulations on large public gatherings. These events not only help many municipalities meet their SWMP requirement for public involvement, but also assist in cleaning up the area and educating community members on the importance of taking care of their local environment. That's why daily, small-scale measures performed by individuals can have a lasting impact, but this is only successful if everyone participates.

### **Do Your Part to Help Your Community**

The public is urged to abide by these guidelines when disposing PPE:

- Single-use masks, gloves, and wipes are NOT recyclable nor bio-degradable and should NOT be disposed of on the ground. Dispose of them in the Trash.
- All used PPE should be disposed in a trash receptacle.
- Improper disposal creates a health and environmental hazard.
- Use of reusable or cloth masks is encouraged to reduce the amount of PPE in area landfills and help fight the spread of COVID-19.

### **Tip of the Month by Matt Jones**Balance for Better Contact

You can have the prettiest swing ever, but if you do not hit the shot "solid", it doesn't' matter. I have seen many swings that were not all that good, but they work. They work, because the golfer maintains balance throughout the entire swing. This will ensure better contact of the ball. There is no substitute for solidness of contact in your shot. Think about many other sports that are hitting, throwing or shooting. To be good they all require balance. A basketball player will make more shots if they stop, set up and shoot with balance vs falling sideways or backwards as they shoot. A great pitcher is going to have balance from the time he starts his wind up all way through the delivery. Same with golf. From the time you start your swing till the ball is hit and you're in your total "finish position" you MUST have perfect balance to constantly hit it solid. One drill I used for many years back in my playing days was making swings with my eyes closed. Hold the club approx. 6" off the ground, get your normal address position and make a full swing. Swing it 20% harder than your normal speed. Maintain your balance each time. If you would literally do just 25 of those a day (175 per week - 9125 per year!) I promise, you would be a better golfer.

### **Departmental Promotion**What to say during a 911 call?

In the United States when calling 911, the emergency dispatcher will usually start the question by saying something like "What's your emergency?" To expedite help, take a deep breath while calling to focus and calm yourself, and in a clear and calm voice be prepared to answer the following questions:

• Nature of emergency: Such as vehicle collision, fire, medical or trauma emergency, behavioral emergency, situation requiring law enforcement, or special situation (such as hazardous materials spill or other issue requiring containment or special rescue).

- Location of emergency: Be as specific as possible. Examples: The specific area of the building or property, which side of the road or intersection and any instructions for accessing the site including the direction of approach or gate/security codes
- A call back number: In case, the call is disconnected or responders have trouble finding the site.
- Number of people affected and their conditions: This is important so appropriate number of resources can be dispatched to your location. . Helpful basic information to provide include whether the victims are breathing, pulse present and any significant bleeding or other life-threatening injuries. Supervisor Training -Sergeants Brandon and Bearden attended the Texas

Department of Public Safety Concept 2 Row Instructor certification course in Bastrop, Texas. This physical fitness test will be utilized to evaluate potential applicants during the hiring process. Our current staff will be encouraged to voluntarily participate in this proven DPS wellness program to improve their overall mental and physical fitness.

### Street Panels and Sidewalk Initiative

As you may have noticed, your Public Works staff have been hard at work repairing street panels and sidewalks throughout the City. To establish a baseline for the planning and scheduling of repairs, the department has compiled and categorized data identifying areas of concern/safety. Based on the available staff and budget, this initiative is expected to span over several fiscal years. City staff will conduct assessments periodically to guide cost-effective decisions that prioritize improvements, address pedestrian hazards, and enhance the City's infrastructure. Over the last year, Public Works has remediated nearly 12,000 saft of sidewalks and 14,000 sqft of street panels exhibiting severe displacement and have placed areas with minor deficiencies on a list for future repair.

In an effort to prioritize safety, our infrastructure operational strategy will continue to focus on areas meeting safety conditions in the #3 and #2 categories.

For all homeowners wondering how we prioritize the repairs, we thought we would show you our methods. We strive toward safety first and aesthetics second. Additionally, the department will develop a plan to guide long-term

street and sidewalk improvements with more information to follow as the initiative progresses. We will publish our plans in the next newsletter. Be sure to check back for regular updates... Stay tuned!







### **Condition #1 (Light)**

Sidewalk has minor cracks and separation of joints. None of the disjointed sections are greater than ½ inch. The sidewalk has settled and water ponds in low areas.

### Condition #2 (Medium)

Sidewalk has a displaced joint or a crack that has separation of ½ inch to 2 inches.

### Condition #3 (Severe)

Sidewalk has displacement of 2 to 4 inches. This may be caused by a tree root or settling of the sections and presents a tripping hazard for pedestrians.

### Recommended Procedure If You Have a Water Problem in Your House

Winter Storm Uri's freezing temperatures caused pipe breaks and water leaks of historic proportions. The following quick steps may help as you make repairs.

- 1. If a leak is noticed, isolate the leak and call a plumber.
- **2**. If the leak is fairly simple, such as a broken sink faucet, shut off the water by closing the valve under the sink.
- **3.** If water is leaking within the walls or ceiling, stop the flow by turning off the valve where the water enters your house in order to minimize damage.
- **4.** If the handle is pointed up or down, the water is typically flowing and the valve is Open. If the handle is turned 90° to the pipe then

the valve is typically not flowing or Off. If you are unable to stop the flow of water, contact Public Works for help

**5.** Once repairs are complete, contact Public Works so we can turn the water back on if the plumber has not already done so. ### **Get Flood Insurance Today!**

Your homeowner's insurance policy does not cover you for floods. However, because Jersey Village participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), you can purchase a separate flood insurance policy. This insurance is backed by the Federal government and is available to everyone, even properties that have been flooded. Getting a flood insurance policy will help to pay for repairs after a flood, and in some cases it may help to pay for the costs of elevating a substantially damaged building. If your property is not mapped in a Special Flood Hazard area, you may qualify for a lower-cost Preferred Risk Policy. Some people have purchased flood insurance because it was required by the bank when they get a mortgage or home improvement loan. Usually these policies just cover the building structure and not

the contents. Be sure you have contents coverage. Don't wait for the next flood to buy flood insurance protection. In most cases, there is a 30-day waiting period before National Flood Insurance program coverage takes effect, so be proactive and get your flood insurance today! The City also has information located at City Hall, and on our website at https:// www.jerseyvillagetx.com/page/city. flood control, that can assist you in assessing your flooding threat. Some of the information includes basic FIRM information and information specific for your home. The city also tracks problems not shown on the firm. We can provide information about flood depth data, historical flood information, and advise you on natural floodplain functions. We also have resources on property protection.





### **Vacation/Travel Safety Tips**

Summer is the peak time for many people to go on vacation, and thieves know this as well. Before leaving on vacation, make sure that all doors and windows are locked, making sure to check all entry points to the garage and second story windows. If you will be away for several days, stop the delivery of mail and let your neighbors know you are going to be on vacation. Make your home look as if someone is there by leaving a timed light on inside your home to go on and off at specific times. Let a neighbor use your drive-way while you are gone so that it always appears that someone is at home. Add your residence to the Jersey Village Police Department's House Watch program, through the JVPD website: **Jerseyvillagepd.org** or by calling Police Dispatch at 713-466-5824, and officers will check your home for any suspicious activity or damage.

When vacationing, use only a set amount of debit/credit cards to make purchases. Carry cash in small amounts to keep from displaying large amounts when paying for items. Always travel with two forms of legal identification in case you lose one or that ID is stolen, preferably a passport. NEVER carry your Social Security Card as it is not a form of legal identification. Most importantly, stay off your electronic devices and pay attention to your surroundings when in large groups of people. You can never be too careful.

### **Cyber Crimes Identity Theft**

During this unprecedented time throughout the world, it is even more important that you are aware of the threat of cyber criminals. Having your identity-stolen can be scary and invasive situation to deal with and could have damaging effects on your finances, medical records and even your reputation. If you become a victim, knowing how to respond

and report the incident is vital in getting it resolved in a quick and successful manner. Here are a few tips and resources to assist you in making sure you do what you can to correct the situation.

- Close any unauthorized or compromised credit or charge accounts. Inform the card companies that someone may be using your identity, and find out if there have been any unauthorized transactions.
- Make sure you change your passwords for all online accounts, contact your bank and other financial institutions to freeze your accounts.
- File a report with your local law enforcement agency, even if you are local police department does not have jurisdiction, which is common for online crime that may originate in another jurisdiction or another country. You may be asked to provide a copy of the law enforcement report to your banks, creditors, other businesses, credit bureaus and debt collectors
- Think about what other personal information may be at risk. You may need

to contact other agencies depending on the type of thefl. For example, if a thief has access to your Social Security number, contact the Social Security Administration. You should also contact your state's department of motor vehicles if your driver's license or car registration is stolen. Internet fraud is the use of Internet services or software with Internet access to defraud victims or to otherwise take advantage of them. Internet crime schemes steal millions of dollars each year from victims and continue to plague the Internet through various methods.

Training - All staff has received their 40 hours Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) license re-certification training. Officers and JV Fire Marshals received Standardized Field Sobriety and Taser re-certification. Lt. Keele, Sgt. Limerick, and Sgt. Brandon attending the Stop Sticks "Train the Trainer" instructor's course. Officers received De-Escalation refresher course and eight officers attended the mandatory 40 hours TCOLE Crisis Intervention Training (CIT). ★





### Matt's Tip:

### Balance - a must in a good golf swing

1st - Get your stance wide enough! A general rule is measure the width of your shoulders and then measure from big toe to big toe - they should measure the same.

2nd - Do not reach too far out - your weight will move to your toes at address. If you are on your toes when you swing back your weight will go to your heels; then when you swing down your weight will go back to your toes. This is bad. Try to keep the entire weight of the body on the "balls of your feet" throughout the whole swing - never going from toes to heels and heels to toes.

3rd - Practice balance. Without a ball - grip a club and lift the head of the club one foot off the ground. Close your eyes and make full swings at 75% speed. Feel and visualize your weight balance as you swing.

### City Accepts Parking Permit Applications Beginning August 1, 2021

The Cy-Fair ISD 2021-22 school year begins at the end of August 2021. The City will begin accepting applications on August 1, 2021 for parking permits that allow certain residents to park on certain city streets within the school zones during the 2021-22 school year.

In 1999 City Council passed an ordinance providing exceptions in the no parking/tow-away zones on your street. The ordinance established a permit system, which, upon application, issues two parking permits. A person may park a motor vehicle, which displays the issued permit, on the

street in front of the address on the permit. The parking permit is issued annually upon application at no charge; however, replacement permits are \$25.00 each.


### Public Education Period, 4/2021 -

1/2022, Ordinance 14.312 (6)(e): As of Jan. 1, 2022, the owner of a tree overhanging a street or right-of-way within the city shall prune the branches so that the branches will not severely obstruct the light from any street lamp or obstruct the view of any street intersection and so that there shall be a clear space of

15 feet above street surface of (or) 10 feet above the sidewalk surface. The owner shall be responsible for removing all dead, diseased, or dangerous trees, or broken or decayed limbs, including tree stumps, which constitute a menace to the safety of the public. Tree pruning shall be done in accordance

with accepted arboricultural standards. Sent 140 letters to folks with low hanging tree limbs.

In the meantime, the ordinance requires at least 13' above streets and 8' above sidewalks. But you might as well get used to trimming to the new heights. \*

### Tip of the Month

How far back do we swing? Of course this depends a lot on your flexibility, athletic ability, age or any physical disabilities. But if you are in good shape and are a fairly good athlete / golfer - you can swing back as far as you can - AS LONG AS - vou don't collapse or stiffen your right knee, lift your left foot or knee too much, bend your left arm (right hand golfer), or lose your grip at the top..... Generally for me, my back swing is about a 34 swing in relations to the shaft parallel to the ground. If you can swing the shaft past parallel to the ground and not make the mistakes listed above - then keep going, but most shouldn't or can't. You might find that making a little shorter back swing (or more compact swing) - will improve your golf ball striking. Remember the most important thing in a golf swing is.... Solidness of contact.

### **Deed Restrictions VS. Zoning Ordinances**

On a regular basis, city staff receives questions from residents concerning the differences between a deed restriction and a city zoning ordinance. They often wonder why their neighborhood deed restrictions are not being enforced by the City.

First, it is important to note that the rules and regulations that apply to land use are very complex. However, on a very basic level, deed restrictions are private, contractual covenants which limit land use. Deed restrictions are placed on real property by the owner of the property, for the benefit of that property only, and typically are placed with the intent to enhance the value of the property. In establishing deed restrictions, there are no limitations except for compliance with laws and public policies. Nonetheless, established restrictions affect subsequent owners of the real property for a stated term, and for any extensions.

In addition to deed restrictions, an owner of land may also agree to another typical land use constraint known as a covenant. Covenants impose obligations upon landowners either to do, or not do, certain acts. There are two types of covenants, restrictive covenants and personal covenants. Restrictive covenants are those that "run with the land" and are enforceable. Personal covenants are not enforceable. Generally, deed restrictions and restrictive covenants, may not be enforced by a city. The exception is for a city that has not adopted zoning regulations, and which elects to enforce the restrictions, such as the City of Houston. To learn more about the City of Houston's deed restriction enforcement program, www.houstontx.gov/legal/deed.html.

Since deed restrictions are not automatic, someone must seek to enforce them. Typically, that person will represent one of the following interests:

- 1. The developer of the project;
- 2. The representative of a corporation set up to represent the property owners; or
- 3. An individual property owner.

In connection with item (2) above, a representative of a corporation set up to represent the property owners is typically a homeowners' association or a property owners' association. These associations: a. have a membership primarily consisting of the owners of the property covered by the dedicatory instrument for the residential subdivision; and b. manage or regulate the residential subdivision for the benefit of the owners of property in the residential subdivision.

Zoning ordinances provide the police power to protect the health, safety, and public welfare of the community. This is a legislative power exercised by the City. Therefore, the goal of zoning is the protection of the community through regulation of land use that is focused on the benefit of the whole community. These zoning restrictions are enforced by the city and violations constitute Class C misdemeanors. In Jersey Village, where the city exercises zoning authority over land subject to deed restrictions and covenants, both sets of land use rules apply. In applying both, if there is an inconsistency, the more restrictive land use requirement controls. It should also be noted that some land use practices that may be valid under a deed restriction or restrictive covenant are outside the scope of the city's zoning authority.



### Tip of the Month

Do you slice the ball? Sometimes (not always) if you slice the ball it could be in your grip. Too weak (one or both hands turned too much counter clockwise to the clubface) can cause a slice or a ball that is always to the right. If this is you... try turning both your hands a little clockwise on the grip. This can help your hand (i.e. clubface) release sooner and get the clubface more square at impact. If your ball starts going a little too far left, then back off on the distance for clockwise hand position until you get a happy medium. Note: this is for right-handed golfers so opposite for left handles.


# **National Drug Take Back**

# **Know The Rules!**



# **Welcome to Team JV**

Officer Wells comes to us from Huntsville Police Department with over 9 years of law enforcement experience. You can ship them to a UPS/FEDEX/USPS store or have a neighbor keep an eye out for your delivery.



# **Public Works Upcoming Project to Test the City's Water Valves**

Residents may have noticed that Public Works has been active working on our water lines recently. Your City Council has allocated funds to allow us to begin analyzing and upgrading the system. Therefore, Public Works has embarked on a path forward that will assist us in identifying and testing the City's water valves. Since this might cause short disruptions of water service for some residents, Public Works thought we would provide a brief description of how we were approaching this effort.

We need to perform some physical tests on the valves to verify if they are working. This will take some time to complete. We have a contractor that will locate our valves and provide GPS data for entry into our database. The test they will perform includes exercising the valve to see if it turns properly. The main method we use to obtain results is to turn the valve off and visually watch to see what they affect. In this case we use Fire Hydrants to see if the water is being stopped when we turn the valve to the Off position.

The process goes like this: 1) We open a selected fire hydrant. 2) We close the 2 valves surrounding that hydrant. 3) If the hydrant runs dry then we know the valve worked. If the hydrant remains flowing water, then the valve

did not work. At that point we know we have a valve needing repair.

Unfortunately when the hydrant runs dry so do the homes/businesses that are affected by those 2 valves. We do not intend on keeping the water off because as soon as we see the hydrant run dry we have the result we are seeking and we will turn the valve right back on again. So any outages should be a fairly short duration of a half hour or less.

The reason we need to turn 2 valves per hydrant is because the City has a "Looped" water system. Overall this is a reasonable design because if the water was to turn off in one direction it is immediately supplemented by the water coming from the opposite direction.

This project will be ongoing and the first phase will be to target any valves on our main lines of 12" diameter. Over the coming years we will likely narrow this scope to include other important valves in the City's network. As we expand the area of analysis we will post to the web and make every effort to reach out to affected homeowners.

This work will commence in October and likely continue for several weeks. We appreciate your patience as we work through this effort. ★

# **Saving Water Indoors**

Here are some easy ways to reduce the amount of water you may use and save money at the same time. Saving water inside your home is easier than you think. In addition to saving money on your utility bill, water conservation reinforces our community's quality of life by ensuring availability of this precious resource.

- ★ Repair or replace dripping faucets and waterlines that leak:
- ★ Wash vegetables and fruits in a bowl or basin using a vegetable brush instead of letting the water run;
- ★ Replace low flow and water saving appliances when replacing washing machines, dishwashers, toilets, and faucets;
- ★ Replace showerheads with a more efficient low flow model. A new shower head can save up to 6 gallons of water per minute;
- ★ Do not use running water to thaw meat or other frozen foods. Defrost food overnight in the refrigerator or use the defrost setting on your microwave;
- ★ Check all toilets in the house for leaks twice a year and repair if it is leaking;
- ★ Turn off the water while you brush your teeth and save four gallons a minute. That's 200 gallons a week for a family of four;
- ★ When washing dishes by hand, use a sink full of soapy water. Don't let the water run continuously; and
- ★ Run the dishwasher only when fully loaded.

A few small changes in your daily routine can have a big impact on the amount of money left in your pocket after the arrival of your water bill.



# Public Works Reminder - Illegal Dumping is a Violation of our SWPPP Requirements

This is a JV Public Service message required by our MS4 requirements. Used mattresses, torn couches, broken TVs, tires, and who knows what's in that drum..., these are common items that are sometimes illegally dumped in the City limits. Not only are these items an eyesore, but they also affect our quality of life and become a safety issue. Rodents, roaches, snakes, and other critters are commonly found in these piles of trash. Stagnant water can attract mosquitos and other bugs. In addition, unknown chemicals, liquids, or harmful materials can be released during rainfall events and impair our precious nearby water bodies. Broken glass, exposed metal, nails, screws, and other hazards can cause serious injuries or worse if curious kids (or adults) investigate the pile, not to mention odor nuisance for the community. Studies have shown that the waste for illegal dumping is usually transported less than 3 miles from the perpetrator's home or business. Did you know that the City can fine or file criminal charges if the offender is caught? The



JV Police this month caught someone dumping garbage in the parking lot. They left a receipt behind with their name on it. These random acts of illegal dumping are burdensome to City workers and costly for the City to properly dispose. It's a unique challenge for the City to monitor all areas within their boundaries - especially those that are hidden or not traveled often.
