The portal streamlines several city processes, making it a more efficient and effective way to do business. It provides a transparent look at the types of revenue we collect and how we allocate those public funds. The


charts, graphs, and tables included are all highly interactive and we invite you to explore. The site is updated at the beginning of every week.

**Commendations:** On Monday, December 20, 2021, Officers Garcia, Gonzalez and Hill were presented with the departmental "Police Commendation Bar" at Decembers City Council meeting.

Incident Summary: On Thursday, September 19, 2021 at 10:28 pm, Officer's Oscar Garcia, Issiac Gonzales, and Dustin Hill, responded to

an arson fire at the Kessler Apartment Complex Apt. #2704. The responding officers arrived on scene before the Fire Department and observed heavy smoke and visible flames coming from the apartment building. Without hesitation, these officers implemented a plan to start clearing apartments. They knew there was a good chance families may be sleeping and overtaken by the heavy smoke. Without regard for their own safety all three officers began forcing doors open to apartments adjacent to the one that was on fire, searching the apartments for trapped or incapacitated family members. While searching these apartments the officers were exposed to heavy smoke, so thick they had a hard time breathing or seeing at times. In apartment #2706, Officers Hill and Garcia located a small dog, Muffin, who was in his crate and unable to escape or seek any shelter from the heavy smoke that was filling the apartment. Muffin's owner, Michael Zamara, was at work and was therefore unaware that his apartment building

was on fire and unable to rescue his dog or call anyone to assist Muffin. Officer's Hill and Garcia removed the doa from the apartment and were able to return Muffin to his owner. Without the brave and selfless act of these three officers, putting themselves at risk from the heavy smoke, Muffin certainly would have died within minutes from asphyxiation. Apartment 2706 is directly adjacent and backs up to apartment that had the heaviest smoke of the units the officers entered. Their actions exemplify what law enforcement officers do on a daily basis throughout our great nation by putting their own safety in jeopardy to protect others. Officers Garcia, Gonzales and Hill are worthy to receive the Police Commendation Bar for their outstanding performance involving great risk to their personal safety while performing their duties. \*

### Keep the City of Jersey Village Clean

Used mattresses, torn couches, broken TVs. tires, and who knows what's in that drum... these are common items that are illegally dumped in the City limits. Not only are these items an eyesore, but they also affect our quality of life and become a safety issue, Rodents, roaches, snakes, and other critters are commonly found in these piles of trash. Stagnant water can attract mosquitos and other bugs. In addition, unknown chemicals, liquids, or harmful materials can be released during rainfall events and impair our precious nearby water bodies. Broken glass, exposed metal, nails, screws, and other hazards can cause serious injuries or worse if curious kids (or adults) investigate the pile. Not to mention odor nuisance for the community. Studies have shown that the waste for illegal dumping is usually transported less than 3 miles from the perpetrator's home or business. Did vou know that the City can fine or file criminal charges if the offender is caught?

These random acts of illegal dumping are burdensome to City workers and costly for the City to properly dispose. It's a unique challenge for the City to monitor all areas within their boundaries – especially those that are hidden or not traveled offen. We are asking everyone to be responsible

### Residential Trash Pick Up Information

Solid waste and recycling services are provided to City residents through tax revenues.

The City currently contracts with GFL for solid waste and recycling services. Solid waste pick-up days are on Tuesday and Friday; recycling is picked-up on Wednesday. Please have waste/recycling ready for collection no later than 7:00 a.m. Heavy trash items can be picked up on waste collection days (Tuesday or Friday), however, these items are limited to one (1) heavy trash item per collection day.

Currently, homeowners must provide their own waste cans which are available for purchase at most home improvement stores. Recycling bins are provided to city residents by GFL. A recycle bin can be requested by calling Public Works at 713-466-2133.

### **Public Works Major Accomplishments in 2021**

- ★ The Wall St and Berm projects are just about complete.
- ★ Eliminated all of the city's documented
- ★ Public Works is slowly building its Safety and Compliance program by adding safety devices!
- ★ We responded to the Ice Storm Uri and assisted hundreds of homeowners with leaks and icina issues.
- ★ Completed the City's required agency reports such as: Risk/Resilience study, Emergency Response Plan and our Drought Response Program, the EPP, Emergency Preparedness Plan. The 2021 MS4 study, our CRS study for flood insurance were all submitted. All permits are being renewed as needed.
- ★ In 2021, we acquired our new Street Sweeper from a grant that we obtained from VW.
- ★ Our Streets Division constructed/repaired sidewalks for 42 homes, 30 new curb and gutter repairs were done and 6 street panel replacements were completed in 2021 all within budget. We are planning on rebuilding 50 different sidewalks this year.
- ★ We are assembling a small laboratory for the Plant Division where we acquired a

- microscope and a CCTV camera so we can perform our own work!
- ★ Improved Record Keeping for the City, we have now digitized all of our hardcopy plans.
- ★ We helped build our TxDOT Soundwall along the South of Jersey Village.
- ★ The City repaired 16 Major water main breaks some of which lost us 500,000 gallons of water. We bill the contractors who cause us these issues. Good job to Derrick's team.
- ★ Our Fleet department purchased and installed equipment on 25+ vehicles. Repeating this year as well. Fleet auctioned our used vehicles for a 45% profit over the purchase price! Nice job Jose!
- ★ Public Works painted all of your streets for stop bars, striping etc. We will repeat this year.
- ★ Developed and trained several staff to develop a F.O.G. (fats, oils, greases) program for the City. We also completed the conversion from Chlorine to Chloramines and we completed our installation of SCADA systems on the plants and storage tanks.
- ★ In addition to normal operations and work orders, Public Works has embarked on several CIP projects for the City. The elevated water towers are being rehabilitated, the Seattle well is being plugged, the Soundwall was completed. All of our water valves will be

tested and exercised for 2022 as a major CIP project for this year.

- ★ Repaired several large sinkholes in the City. One was 10' deep and we backfilled it.
- ★ We also manage the White Oak Bayou Joint Powers Board and instituted several initiatives comprising: obtaining bids for purchases, requiring permits and inspections for all activities at the plant and addressing the drainage issues at the plant.
- ★ Your JV Fleet Division was awarded the Blue Seal of Excellence award by the ASE (Automotive Service Excellence) for the complete set of automotive certifications and licenses that our mechanics have. We are the only municipality in the region that won this award! Conarats Jose!
- ★ Public Works has been focusing on culture change, specifically Training, Education, Licensing and Certifications for staff. The law requires that many PW employees be licensed or certified to perform their jobs. We take that seriously and we have built a "Wall of Knowledge" showing the increasing certifications for each staff member. The city staff is 100% credentialed for their positions as of 12/2021. ★

### **Tip of the Month**

Warm up for Better Scores! How many golfers race to the course, head to the 1st tee and then immediately tee off without warming up? The first 2 or 3 holes are a disaster. Sometimes playing so much better later in the round. After the round, saying "man if I wouldn't have started triple, double, triple - I could have broken 90!" Always try to arrive 30-45 minutes before your tee time to warm up. A small bucket is fine (40-50 balls) and then spend 10 minutes on the putting green. Hit mostly short irons to start (8, 9 and wedges). Then finish up the last 10 balls with a couple of long irons and a few drivers. The greens can always be different speeds from day to day, so spend the last 10-15 minutes putting before teeing off to "get the speed down." Warm up before your tee time - it is a auarantee for a better score.

### **Coody Completes Recertification**

Lorri Coody, City Secretary, City of Jersey Village, completed her required professional education for recertification as a Texas Registered Municipal Clerk. She was awarded her certificate on January 13, 2022.


Certification and recertification are neither easy nor automatic. Original certification required successful completion of approximately 200 hours of individual home study on a fourcourse curriculum and attendance at 96 hours of professional development seminars. Recertification requires 72 hours of classroom instruction and a selection of additional education options which may include: college-level courses, certificate from the CPM, or facilitated book discussions with independent comprehension assessments.



### Build Your Speed for Better Temp

I sometimes see players that struggle with tempo because they start the swing all wrong. They immediately start back from the ball too fast or quick. A baseball pitcher starts his arm and shoulder back extremely slow and then starts increasing speed as he gets towards the top. Try this in your swing. For the first 2 to 3 feet, swing your arms and shoulders very slow and then as you start to get waist high increase the speed all the way to the top and keep that speed consistent through the hit. This can help your tempo!

### Tip of the Month

### **Got the Chili Dips?**

If you have a problem with that 5, 10 or 20 yard shot with your wedges – also known as hitting a "chili dip" or a "fat shot" – here are 3 things that can help.

- 1. Always play the ball a little farther back in your stance. I see many people place the ball in the same forward position where they hit their normal irons.
- 2. Set your feet closer together and have a more open stance (remember more open means direction of the foot line is pointing a little to the left).
- 3. Choke down on the grip. Don't hold all the way on the end like a full shot. Choke at least half way down on the grip. This will help eliminate "fat" shots.

Try these 3 tips with all wedges for those 25 yards and in shots.

### **Get Flood Insurance Today!**

Your homeowner's insurance policy does not cover you for floods. However, because Jersey Village participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), you can purchase a separate flood insurance policy. This insurance is backed by the Federal government and is available to everyone, even properties that have been flooded. Getting a flood insurance policy will help to pay for repairs after a flood, and in some cases it may help to pay for the costs of elevating a substantially damaged building. If your property is not mapped in a Special Flood Hazard area, you may qualify for a lower-cost Preferred Risk Policy. Some people have purchased flood insurance because it was required by the bank when they get a mortgage or home improvement loan. Usually these policies just cover the building structure and not the contents. Be sure you have contents coverage. Don't wait for the next flood to buy flood insurance protection. In most cases, there is a 30-day waiting period before National Flood Insurance program coverage takes effect, so be proactive and get your flood insurance today!

The City also has information located at City Hall, and on our website at https://www.jerseyvillagetx.com/page/city.flood\_control, that can assist you in assessing

your flooding threat. Some of the information includes basic FIRM information and information specific for your home. The city also tracks problems not shown on the firm. We can provide information about flood depth data, historical flood information, and advise you on natural floodplain functions. We also have resources on property protection.



### Tip of the Month

### How do we aim?

Ever have those days when you are hitting the ball solid, but all your shots are not anywhere near your target? Check your aim! Always remember - YOUR CLUB FACE IS YOUR AIMER. I see too many golfers set up to the ball and aim their body (feet) at the target - wrong! You must set your bottom edge of the club perpendicular to the target (we call that getting your club face "square" in golf). Your club face is your aimer, nothing else and once your clubface is "square" to the target then set your body (feet) on a slightly parallel line to the left off the clubface line to the target (for a right hand golfer). If you are a left hand golfer - your body (feet) will be set on a slightly parallel line to the right of the clubface line to the target.














### Long-Term Flood Recovery Plan Update

As we enter hurricane season it is a good time to review our progress of the Long-Term Flood Recovery Plan. The plan that was adopted, just weeks after Hurricane Harvey hit our area, had recommended structural projects of building a berm around Jersey Meadow Golf Course, E100 channel improvements, Wall Street neighborhood storm sewer improvements. It also had recommended non-structural alternatives recommended that included home elevations/ buyouts and implementation of CRS. Since 2017 we have implemented nearly all those projects. The berm around the golf course is complete. The Wall Street drainage project is complete, and the pump station with it is awaiting electricity to be installed in May. We worked with our federal partners and Harris County to get the E100 channel improvement projects moving forward. That work should be completed this summer. We've written arants for home elevations. So far 21 homes have been elevated and another 32 are in the grant process for elevation.

We have joined the Community Rating System (CRS) at a level 7 and our residents now

see a 15% discount on their flood insurance premiums. In May the application to move to a level 6 rating was submitted. If approved Jersey Village residents will receive a 20% discount on flood insurance for policies issued after April 2023.

On top of those recommendations, we worked with Harris County Flood Control District to include the E127 project in their bond program. The design phase of that project is underway and should be completed later this year. After that is complete, we will work with HCFCD to begin construction.

Overall, approximately \$15 million in federal grant funding has come to the city for these projects. The City Council and city staff worked with HCFCD for another \$1.5 million as well. We continue to work with HCFCD and our federal partners to bring in more grant money to alleviate future flooding, with current requests of over \$9 million that have been submitted. ### CITY COUNCIL INCREASES HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

On June 20, 2022, City Council increased the City's Homestead Exemption from 14% to 20%. The change will go into effect for 2022 property taxes.

This change means a home with a taxable value of \$300,000 will only be taxed on a value of \$240,000 for city taxes. If residents are eligible for any other





When selecting the right person to go to Uvalde to represent the City of Jersey Village and the Jersey Village Police Department, we knew that Officer Garcia was the perfect officer to send. Officer Garcia leads by example for his fellow officers. He is dedicated to his profession and this agency. He prides himself in exhibiting a level of professionalism and is dedicated to accomplishing any assignment given to him immediately. Officer Garcia demonstrates a strong work ethic, positive attitude and compassion for others on a daily basis. Officer Garcia was assigned to Uvalde Texas from May 5, 2022 through June 24, 2022. During his time in Uvalde, he assisted in patrol, security details, and escorts dignitaries. 




### Tip of the Month

### Why is it SO HARD to make putts?

I have a saying "putting is the easiest thing to do, but it is the hardest thing to be good at." There are two (2) main things to concentrate on with putting:

- 1. AIM Not your feet and not your body but your putter head. Imagine your putter as a straight line and adjust it to perpendicular to the target "square" in golf terms.
- 2. FEEL FOR DISTANCE Distance of a putt is "feel." Uphill, downhill, fast greens, slow greens you have to "feel" how hard to stroke it. Always try to run the ball by the hole 1' to 2' if you miss. Never try to die the ball into the hole. Concentrate on these two things for better putting.

A few members of the Planning and Zoning Commission sought clarification concerning the need to have golf carts licensed by the State of Texas. It was pointed out that our website page concerning golf carts states that license plates are required, but the Ordinance actually passed by City Council back on June 15, 2020, was not clear concerning the need for golf carts to have a license plate.

In reviewing this matter, the Ordinance was amended on September 12, 2022 clarifying the State's license plate requirement in the City's Code – the only change made between the State law and the City's Code will be to use the word "road" instead of "highway".

Every golf cart operated within the city shall be equipped with all the following equipment:

- headlights, tail lamps,
- reflectors, parking brakes,
- rearview mirrors license plate; and

• a slow moving vehicle emblem as provided for in Texas Transportation Code §547.703, as it exists at the time of the adoption of this article or as it may be amended thereafter.

To apply for a license plate please submit this Application (Form 130-U) along with a photocopy of your title, and a check or money order for \$15 made payable to:
Ann Harris Bennett and a note stating you are requesting Off-Highway License plates. A copy of the form can be found on the City's website page www.jerseyvillagetx. com/page/city.golfcarts.

If your lead hand is less in the fingers, your forward hand is more in the fingers and the V's that are made by the forefinger and thumb point anywhere from your chin to your right shoulder – you are good regardless of which grip you are using.

Most of my Professional playing career, I overlapped. Now that I'm older and have some aches and pains in my hands and arms, I interlock. When I was a high school and college player, I used the ten finger grip. It just really doesn't matter, pick one and practice.



#### Tip of the Month

#### Golf is a 4-hour game!

No one likes to wait on someone in front of them on every shot. A golf round should move smoothly and swiffly. You don't have to hurry all the time, but play what we call, "ready golf." It takes you and all golfers on the course to do your part and keep your 4-hour pace. Examples are:

- We have GPS monitors on every cart showing distance to the front-middle-back of the green. Glance at the location of the pin, figure your "estimated" yardage, pick your club and hit it!
- When your partner is hitting guess your "estimated" yardage and grab several clubs and walk to your ball when they are hitting.
- Limit your practice swings. One is plenty. I take none.
- Know the rules so if you are in a penalty area or out of bounds or ground under repair or casual water – you know what to do and drop a ball and hit it!
- When you need to chip, take several clubs in case you need more or less loft and take your putter!
- When on the green, read your putt while others are putting – so you are ready to putt when it is your turn.
   Don't mark 2 footers! Walk up and putt out.
- Use the beverage cart when you can and don't get cooked to order food at the turn. We only allow 10 minutes max from #9 green to when you tee off #10.

#### **Tip of the Month**

#### **Please Help Our Course!**

It is so hard to maintain quality turf on the course. Of course, we have our full time course maintenance staff, but GOLFERS CAN HELP TOO! Here is a list of some of the things that matter (especially in the winter months):

- We have ENTER and EXIT post on all the par 4's and 5's. The carts should only enter the fairway past the enter post and always return back to the path well before the exit post.
- "The 90 degree rule" means to always drive on the cart path as much as possible and when you are even with your ball in the fairway drive out straight to the ball and drive straight back to the cart path. Never run parallel to the cart path or straight down the fairway.
- Par 3's are always cart path only but sometimes we need a reminder.
- Sand your divots after iron shots. Our carts provide 2 sand bottles and we have a refill box on #5 and #14. You can also exchange full bottles for empty bottles at the 10th tee.
- Fix your ball mark on every green plus 2 more!
- Stay in the middle of the cart path and pay attention when making turns. This will avoid making ruts on the edge of the cart paths.
- Don't drive your cart to every ball. It is okay to walk some, right?

These are just a few tips to help do your part as the golfer. We have a true vision to get our course to the best conditions ever!
