## Planning a Trip



Family vacations are exciting and can be a lot of fun, but receiving a phone call that your home caught fire while you're away is something you never want to have happen. Spring Break is just around the corner and many of you are planning a vacation. Here are a few suggestions to consider doing around your home before leaving.

1. Unplug items- Appliances like toaster ovens, washer and dryers, your dishwasher and microwaves are items that won't be used while you are away. Unplug these items so no current is flowing through those cords. Unplug lamps and televisions you will not have on timers.

2. Use approved UL listed timers and strip plugs with circuit protection to power the items you intend to leave on. These items are readily available at local stores.

3. Make sure your smoke detectors are functioning and will send a signal to the alarm company if it is monitored. Smoke detectors are the first indication something is happening. Making sure they are properly working and sending the signal to the alarm company, will expedite getting the fire department to your home.

4. Pet proof your home. Some animals may be left unattended and may be free to roam around the home until a caretaker arrives. Secure those items that would entice them to play or wander in areas that are not the normal play area.

5. Close all doors to all rooms. Fire needs to have Oxygen, Heat and something to burn to sustain itself. Closing doors will help keep smoke and fire from traveling to other areas of the home. It could also help to put a fire out if the room is sealed enough and all the oxygen in the room is used up.

Finally, consider placing your home on the Police Department House Watch list during the time you are gone. This not only is beneficial to you because a police officer is watching, but it is beneficial to your neighbors too when they see an officer roaming your street throughout the day and night. ★

## Recent / Upcoming Public Works Projects

Currently, Elwood Street and Sue Lane are being reconstructed. This project includes a new road, new water service, new storm water service, new water meters, and new streetlights.

Water meters will be replaced during the next four (4) years. In 2016, the meters will generally be replaced along the 290 Frontage Road and the area north of Smith Street. If your water bill account number starts with a 1 or 2, your meter will be replaced in 2016. There is no cost to the property owner for this update.

Sewer lines are being relined to ensure maximum operation and to increase the useful lifespan of the pipes. The relining procedure occurs every other year following a camera inspection process.

A SCADA project will be undertaken so that the water system can be monitored in "real time".

A traffic study has been conducted and the results are expected in March 2016.

Back-up generators have been installed at the water plants so that they can function properly during emergency operations. ★
